

An Annual General Meeting of the Association shall be held in each calendar year at a time and place that may be determined by the Association at the previous Annual General Meeting or failing such determinations at a time and place as determined by Council.

Annual Meeting Rules & Procedures

When approved by a majority of members present at the Annual Meeting, these rules and procedures will apply throughout the sessions of the Annual Meeting of the Saskatchewan Association of Licensed Practical Nurses.

Order of Business:

1. The order of business for the Annual Meeting of the Saskatchewan Association of Licensed Practical Nurses shall be that printed in the Annual Report.
2. Kerr & King Rules of Order shall be the parliamentary authority.

Rules of Debate:

1. Speakers shall use the microphones, address the chair and state their name and place of residence. The Chairperson will call speakers in the order in which they stand behind the microphones.
2. Participation at meetings is open to all in attendance, however, only practising member can vote.
3. Motions must be made by a practising member and must be seconded by a practising member. To ensure accuracy, the Chairperson may require that a motion or an amendment to a motion be presented, in writing, and be signed by the persons who moved and seconded it.
4. Each person may speak once only to each motion. The mover to the motion may speak twice, once when making the motion and a second time to close the debate. The mover may also be asked to correct misapprehensions or to offer explanations brought forward in the debate. However, when the mover speaks for the second time, debate is closed. The mover of the amendment does not have the right to reply. The Chairperson will exercise the responsibility of the Chair to limit debate.
5. Amendments must be introduced by motion and will be voted on before the main motion is put to vote.
6. No more than two amendments may be on the floor at the same time.
7. Each speaker will be limited to a maximum of two minutes.
8. Notwithstanding any of the above, debate on any one item of business shall be limited to one hour.
9. Resolutions and motions shall be decided by the majority of votes of the members present each currently licensed member being entitled to one vote.

All questions voted on at a meeting of the Association shall be decided by plurality of the votes of members present in person, each member in good standing being entitled to one vote.
