
Good Standing

Background:

Subsection 19(1.1) of The Licensed Practical Nurses Act, 2000 provides for registration in SALPN by a person who is equivalent to a practical nurse in “good standing” pursuant to the legislation of another province or territory of Canada.

Interpretation:

An applicant from another Canadian jurisdiction is considered to be in “good standing” when he or she has no discipline record or pending complaints in their jurisdiction of origin and has paid all amounts owing to the professional body in that jurisdiction.

Procedure:

1. Confirmation of an applicant’s status in another Canadian jurisdiction will be obtained by the Registrar directly from the professional body in that jurisdiction.
